

#### PANHANDLE ARCHEOLOGICAL SOCIETY



The meeting was called to order by President Erin Frigo at 7:04 p.m. via a hybrid meeting at the Southwest Library and ZOOM.

There were 24 persons in attendance.

PROGRAM: The program for the evening was by Matthew Boulanger talking about current research in obsidian sourcing.

MINUTES: Erin moved for the May meeting minutes to be approved. Scott seconded it and they were approved.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Paul gave the following report:

- 1. As of November 30, 2021, the balance in the PAS Operations account at Wells Fargo was \$7,087.91. I do not have the End of Year statement yet.
- 2. Following a vot by the membership, another Operations checking account was opened at the Amarillo National Bank. This is where the two Publications accounts, checking and CD are located. The new account was opened with a check from Pam Allison; a small balance is being kept in the old account at Wells Fargo until all the details of the new account are completed.
- 3. One of these details concerns authorized signatures on the ANB accounts. On the recommendation of the bank, Paul Katz, Andy Burcham, and Miranda Bible will be authorized to access all three accounts.
- 4. Another signature problem is being resolved at the Post Office. Now Andy and Paul each have a key to the box; before there was only one key. The record for the box; however, showed that the authorized signatures belonged to Lisa Jackson and Rolla Shaller. Like the bank accounts, changes are being made with the USPS to authorize Paul Katz, Andy Burcham, and Miranda Bible.
- 5. Efforts are underway to establish a PayPal account for the PAS. Once established, Paul will work with Bob Wishoff to place this method of payment on the PAS website. Erin is investigating the possibility of a similar link on the PAS Facebook page.

**PUBLICATIONS REPORT:** Andy reported the Publications Money Market (Checking) Account had a December, 2021 beginning balance of \$2,207.81. Interest earned in December was \$0.19, leaving a month end balance of \$2,208.00

The Publications 180 Day CD continues with a balance of \$5,355.01. The CD will mature again and pay interest in February, 2022.

MARKETING: Erin reported that there are now over six hundred followers on our Facebook page. The Twitter and Instagram pages are getting more followers also. She also has some bumper stickers for sale.

**OLD BUSINESS:** It was discussed that dues for the year and Studer Banquet money needs to be taken care of if not already done.

# Clovis Fluted Points in Texas: A Further Update to the TCFPS, 4<sup>th</sup> Edition

# Alan M. Slade Lithic Analyst / Palaeolithic Researcher University of Texas at Austin, Texas



#### Abstract

In 1985 David Meltzer of the Southern Methodist Museum (SMU) initiated a survey of Clovis fluted points in Texas (TCFPS). That survey continues to the present, and as of 2007 when the 3<sup>rd</sup> edition was published there was 544 Clovis points recorded by the survey. Clovis occur throughout the state, with concentrations on the High Plains, Coast, and along an arc through central Texas following the Balcones Escarpment along which high quality chert and freshwater sources were readily available.

This presentation will introduce the 4<sup>th</sup> edition of the survey which has come under the control and curation of staff at the Texas Archeological Research Laboratory (TARL). As the current director of the TCFPS I will highlight the aims of the current survey, preliminary results prior to publication later this year, early observations and outline some ideas for future research. An emphasis on how the current survey relates to the Plains / Panhandle region of Texas will also be presented.

## **Biography**

Alan is currently a postdoctoral researcher with the University of Texas at Austin, Texas Archaeological Research Laboratory (TARL) and is also a member of the team that heads the Prehistory Research Project (PRP). Alan spent fifteen years as a Prehistoric and Palaeolithic field archaeologist in Britain and Europe, and a further decade helping to curate the lithic collections in the British Museum. In 2007 Alan became interested in Early Paleoindian archaeology, in particular Clovis. Alan spent six years studying the Clovis fluted points in collections across North America, largely facilitated and encouraged by Dennis Stanford of the Smithsonian Institution. Dr. Michael Collins invited Alan to continue his analysis of Clovis fluted point technology and to become a lithic analyst for the project in 2019. From 2019 Alan is directing the Texas Clovis Fluted Point Survey (TCFPS) at TARL. Alan was educated in London at Birkbeck College London, University College London (UCL) Institute of Archaeology, and at the University of Southampton. He is a research fellow of the Centre for the Archaeology of Human Origins (CAHO) at the University of Southampton, he is on the committee for the Lithic Studies Society (LSS) and is also an active member of the Society for Museum Archaeologists (SMA). Since 2018 he has been an active member of the Texas Archeological Society, Central Texas Archeological Society and Travis County Archaeological Society.
