





The United States Regiment of Dragoons 1833-1861

Abstract

Fort Leavenworth was built in 1827 by Colonel Henry Leavenworth and a few years later under the command of Colonel Henry Dodge in 1834, companies A, C, D




and G of the U.S. Dragoons had just arrived at Fort Leavenworth. These soldiers were a special unit, trained to fight on horseback as well as on foot, they protected travelers along the Santa Fe trail, and were charged with keeping the peace between the Indians and the Traders in the area. As the years went by Fort Leavenworth eventually became a supply center for other forts that were being established further west. Here we will examine some of the artifacts left behind by these soldiers, found in small camps scattered along the countryside as the U.S. Dragoons were leaving Fort Leavenworth during their many expeditions.

Biography

I'm a Field Operations Supervisor for Kansas Gas Service and this April I will have worked for the company for 36 years. I'm an avocational archaeologist and with the use of a metal detector I specialize in locating early military camps and cabin sites in northeastern Kansas. All artifacts are found on private property with landowner's permission. This collection is very important to me because each and every artifact tells a story.
